

Beginning with our sixth season in the fall of 1997, we have been fortunate to offer joint productions with the Berean Community Players at Stuart's Opera House in Nelsonville.

Moon." Walton Jones's play is part comedy, part musical revue. By making a mock radio broadcast the central event of the show, he has an excuse to use more than a dozen World War II-era tunes. The action takes place in the studio of radio station WOV in December, 1942. Available roles include those for nine men ranging in age from 18 - 60, and for four women ranging in age from 17 - 50.

CRIMES OF THE HEART

Beth Henley's CRIMES OF THE HEART is a black comedy about three Maladjusted sisters set in the small town of Hazelhurst, Mississippi. After opening on Broadway in 1981, CRIMES OF THE HEART won the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for

best new American play and the Pulitzer Prize for drama. Henley also received a Tony Award nomination for best play and, five years later, an Academy Award nomination for best adapted screenplay.

The three central characters in the play are the Magrath sisters: Lenny, the eldest, unmarried and desperate; Meg, just back from a futile attempt to land a singing career in Los Angeles; and Babe, the youngest, trapped in a bad marriage and suffering from depression. The play opens with the news that Babe has shot her well-to-do husband because, as she puts it, "I didn't like his looks." The sisters talk, argue, laugh and cry their way through this amazing play, as they discover truths about each other and themselves.

CRIMES OF THE HEART will close Athenian Players Theatre's tenth season with performances on May 9,10, 11-8:00 p.m. and May 12-3:00 p.m.

A very small but very enthusiastic contingent of members of Athenian Players Theatre attended this year's State OCTAfest convention. This three-day annual event takes place each year over Labor Day weekend, being hosted this year by the Worthington Players at the beautiful Holiday Inn Convention Center in Worthington, Ohio.

OCTAfest 2001 was attended by 645 community theatre members from all around the state - an increase of about 25% over last year.

The event is overflowing with entertainment and educational & social opportunities. It is everything theatre. From the opening night parties & games to the 15 half-hour

play excerpts to the dozen or so various workshops right on through to the Sunday evening banquet & Masked/Formal Ball and Monday morning brunch & Awards Ceremony, there was not a dull moment. Participants were offered all the excitement they could hope for, yet there was time to occasionally relax and catch one's breath.

APT member and frequent director Lonny Fraze gave an extended Directing Workshop, in which Pat Berry Fraze and Steve Haskins assisted by playing out a scene for Lonny's instructional purposes. Additionally, APT President Joe Balding gave two one-hour workshops on beginning tap dance, attended by eager conventioneers.

Although Athenian Players Theatre did not enter a play excerpt in this year's competition, we did not come home empty handed. Linda Watkins took some honors as editor of our newsletter. She won Awards of Merit in Layout & Design and Effective Presentation of Information. Steve Haskins won an honorable mention for his set design for ALL BECAUSE OF AGATHA, APT's March show by Jonathan Troy, directed by Christopher M. Coleman.

The opportunities to learn more, experience more and enjoy more great theatre (and yes, to party more!) are practically endless. The workshops are very informative, offered by experienced persons, and the play excerpts are very entertaining, showcasing an incredible amount of professional level talent. One would be hard put to pay top dollar for better shows than some of those seen on the OCTAfest convention stage. **Next year's convention, OCTAfest** 2002: FUN IN THE SUN, will happen in Akron, Ohio, again over Labor Day weekend. All APT members are strongly urged to give serious consideration to joining in on next year's convention! Yes, we all have jobs and/or school and pretty much full schedules, and yes, community theatre is a hobby for us, but hobbies are an important part of who we are. We deserve to get the most enjoyment out of life (hobbies or not) that we can, so here is a great chance to raise our enjoyment level! Simply put: it's FUN!
