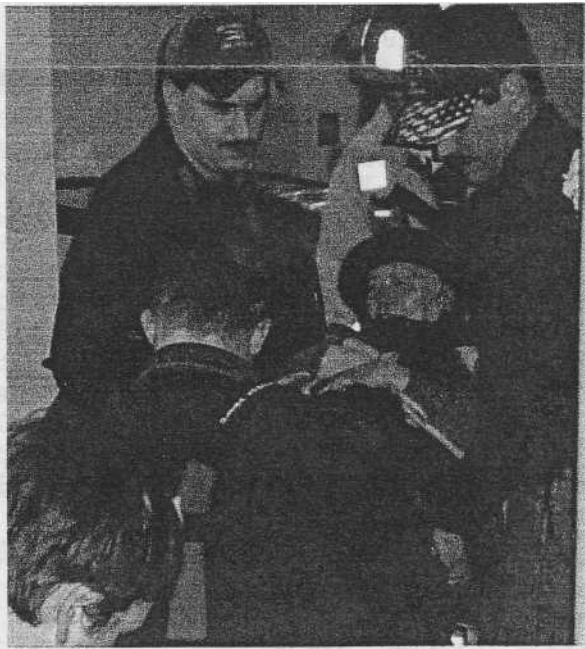
## NFD To The Rescue

## Bad News, Good

Well, here's the bad news: after 12 years (now going on 13), I received a call from Kent Knudson (who, along with his wife Dia, owns Athens Mini Storage on East State Street) saying that because of the recent increase in demand for local storage space (who knew?) they find it necessary to amend their contract with APT. In fact, there never has been a contract. They have always just let us use one of their storage garages for free all these years.

The "good" news: they are offering us a substantial discount on rent. Instead of the normal \$100 / month that they usually get for a 10'x20' garage like ours, they are willing to let us have it for \$50 / month. This cost will not take effect until May, so we have a few weeks to decide whether we can afford to keep our stuff stored there or to move it elsewhere. We really can't complain, since they've given us \$15,000 or so worth of free storage space over the years. In case any of you have ever wondered why there is always an ad in our programs for Athens Mini Storage, or why they're listed as a "Benefactor", now you know.

The *really* good news, however, is that this whole story is BS and you've been taken for an April fool's ride again. Our storage space is still free. Thank you, Kent and Dia! So there.

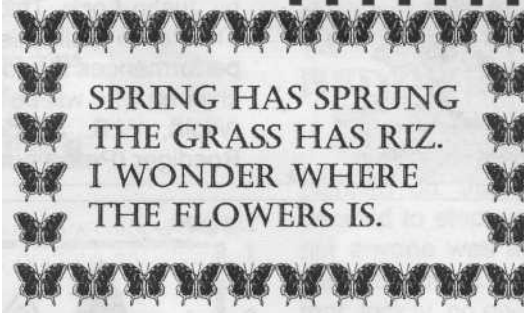
## National Library Week

Sandy McConnell, branch manager of the Nelsonville library, has enlisted the help of APT/BCP in setting up a special feature for their participation in National Library Week, April 19 - 24. Her plan is to set up a "community front porch" inside the library, complete with rocking chairs. The idea is that local writers can use the porch as a stage to read from their books, thus creating an interactive setting for children and adults in the community to learn about and enjoy the books originating in our own area.

An extended version of the idea might include occasional loan of set pieces from our most recent show(s) used as displays (and possibly even play areas for children) to pique the interest of library patrons and to advertise our upcoming productions.

## OCTAfest 2004

Don't forget that this year's SE Region OCTAfest will be on Saturday, June 19, at Cambridge Performing Arts Centre in Cambridge, Ohio. It's a full day of theatre with play excerpts, workshops,



and networking with other thespians from our region. This will be the first chance most of us will have to meet the folks from the newest theatre group to join the Southeast Region, the Deersville Community Players. It remains to be seen whether or not they will bring an excerpt, but some of their members will no doubt show up either way, just for the chance to meet folks from the rest of the region, and to start learning about all the great things OCTA has to offer.

On a related theme, the OCTA Board MPR committee has extended the deadline for the OCTA logo contest through the end of June. The committee will allow an individual to submit more than one entry if they wish. The committee suggests that "1953" be incorporated in the logo along with the comedy/tragedy masks or other theatre items. Other guidelines are still the same (one logo with "OCTA" and one with "Ohio Community Theatre Association", each logo's size between 1.5" and 2.5" and photo-ready) and the logos should be submitted to Executive Director Eleanor Smith, 4042 Blendon Point Drive, Columbus, Ohio 43240. The logo designs will be introduced at the various regional festivals and the winning logo selection will be by ballot at the Annual Conference in Cincinnati - Sept 3-6, 2004. **The next general membership meeting for Athenian Players Theatre will be at the Nelsonville Public Library on Wednesday, April 21, 5:30-7:00 pm.**

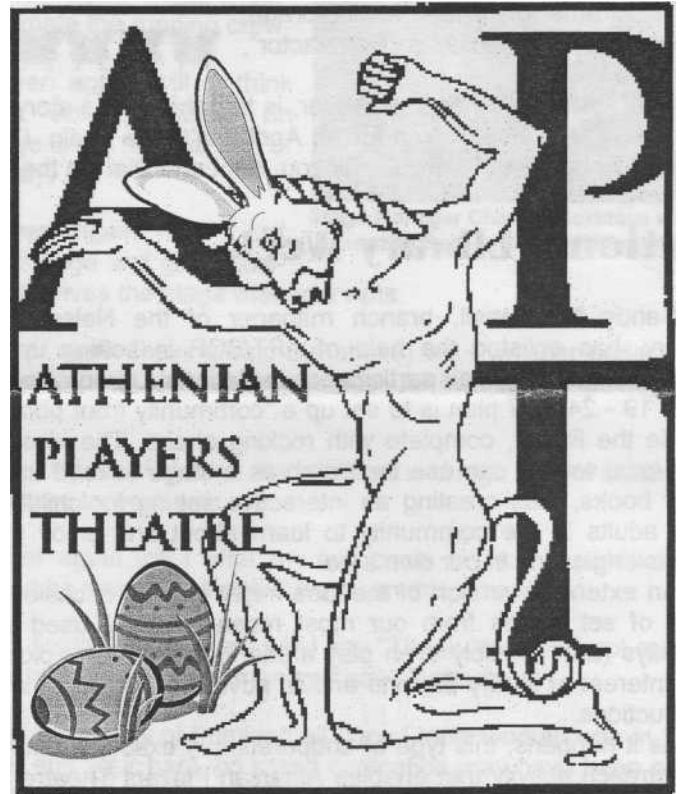
