
Membership elects next year's officers and selects plays for 2005-2006 Season

At the April 12 meeting, all four current APT officers (President Carol Ault, Vice-President Celeste Parsons, Secretary Katie Chaney and Treasurer Sylvia Abbott) were re-elected to serve again in their posts for the 2005-2006 season.

No less than seven (count 'em, seven!) shows were proposed for three slots for our 2005-2006 season. Two musicals and five "straight" plays were offered. After discussion and voting, it was decided that the season will begin with the fall 2005 production of *Belles* (directed by Celeste Parsons), a funny and touching play about six sisters. Following will be the musical *Oliver* (directed by Sylvia Abbott, with musical direction by Lynn Sullivan) in March 2006. The May show will be the Moss/Hart classic *The Man Who Came to Dinner* (directed by Norm Cohn).

A couple of "extra" shows were discussed as possibilities to serve as fundraisers for APT and/or Stuart's Opera House. Tawna Rogers is looking into prospects for a showcase of sorts, possibly a musical variety performance, to be staged during Nelsonville's Parade of the Hills in August. In addition, Sylvia Abbott offered a tentative proposal to perform Mel Helitzer's original musical Oh, Jackie!, about Jackie Kennedy's father, Blackjack Bouvier. It is currently undergoing some re-writes by the author, and is under consideration for performance as an extra show in 2006.

There's a lot to look forward to in our fourteenth season (omigod, 14!), so watch for announcements about exact show dates and make plans to get involved!



This June 4th will be the perfect opportunity to see some unusual sights. Just head to New Philadelphia and watch the stage of Little Theatre of Tuscarawas County for a star-studded show of excerpts from Southeast Ohio's best community theatres!

One excerpt that we know well will be among those performed: Nelsonville's Berean Community Players will take "Visitors From London", the third scene from the March production of Neil Simon's California Suite, directed by Joe Balding and starring Miki Brooks and Charlie Smith.

It is likely that at least half of the Southeast Region's twelve theatres will take excerpts, making it a very full day's worth of theatre for your mere \$10 registration fee. Come support local theatre and see what else is happening in the region, while making new friends.

He will be presenting a concert in late May, and everyone is welcome to attend. The official press release follows:

Norman Cohn, tenor and Margaret McDargh, pianist will present "A FRENCH CONNECTION" on May 29, 2005 at 4 pm in the LUTHERAN CHURCH on Mill St., Athens, Ohio. Selections include arias from the operas of Edouard Lalo (Aubade: Dawn), Benjamin Godard (the Lullaby from JOCELYN), and Jules Massenet (The Dream from MANON). Chansons by Maurice Ravel, and songs by Reynaldo Hahn (to the poems of Francois Coppee, Victor Hugo, and Paul Verlaine), are included in the first half of the program. Among the pieces in the second half of the program is a lovely, romantic one by Francis Poulenc (The Paths of Love, with text by Jean Anouilh), and familiar songs from Jacques Brel and Edith Piaf. The program will last approximately one hour, and is open to the public.
