SE Regional OCTAfest

Representing the Berean Community Players on June 4th, the cast and crew of *California Suite* (*Visitors from London*) hit the stage of Little Theatre of Tuscarawas County in New Philadelphia as the second of four excerpts



from member theatres in the Southeast Region of the Ohio Community Theatre Association. The cast of Miki Brooks and Charlie Smith gave a terrific performance. It was, according to director Joe Balding,

as good as, if not even better than, any performance during the regular run of the show, which is saying a lot. The audience, made up mostly of members of other SE Region theatres, seemed to love it, too, if their frequent bursts of laughter were any indication.

The other three excerpts were Little Theatre of Tuscarawas County with Angel Street, Excalibur Productions with Breast Entanglements and Actors Guild of Parkersburg with Night Watch.

While all three responders had good

constructive criticism and numerous compliments for all of the excerpts, we were disappointed in not receiving any awards of recognition for acting or directing, but instead came home with an award for Excellence in Establishing Environment. The stage did look pretty darn good when we were through transforming it into a comfortable hotel suite, but the action and interplay of the actors were, in all our minds, the real stars.

So, in the end, Angel Street was selected to represent our region at State Conference over Labor Day weekend, and Night Watch was chosen as the alternate. We are hoping that both will be able to perform at Conference, as both were very strong excerpts. Angel Street is a Victorian drama which earned awards for directing, acting, costumes and hairstyles. Night Watch is a present-day drama with some very surprising twists and an amazing performance by the female lead, Chris Dolen.

You can see these and many other excellent excerpts at "Close Encounters of the Theatre Kind", this year's State Conference at the Holiday Inn French Quarter in Perrysburg, Ohio over Labor Day weekend. The Conference always offers many great theatre workshops, too, as well as games and dances and parties. There's always more to do than one has time for, so it's impossible to be bored.
